Re: Status of benefit related matters

The Board of Trustees of the RHC Trust (the "Board") recognizes that it is vested with the authority and responsibility for the management and administration of the RHC Trust, including, but not limited to designing, adopting, maintaining and administering the Health Care Plan for Police and Fire Retirees of the City of Detroit (the "Plan"). In accordance with this authority and responsibility the Board continued the plan design and benefit structure implemented by the City of Detroit throughout the 2015 calendar year, albeit with the legally required exchange of the cash stipend to a Health Reimbursement Arrangement (HRA).

During its administration of the Plan throughout the 2015 calendar year the Board discovered numerous issues relating to the accuracy and reliability of member data and records provided by the City. Accordingly, the Board elected to maintain the current plan design and benefit structure into the 2016 calendar year until more reliable data and information could be gleaned through open enrollment and data verification efforts. Through such efforts the Board has been able to obtain additional data and information with respect to the RHC Trust's membership and such data has been provided to the RHC Trust's actuary for analysis.

The Board is also aware of existing concerns amongst the RHC Trust's membership regarding plan design, benefit eligibility, funded status, etc., and the Board has made diligent efforts to address such concerns both individually and collectively through discussions with its professional advisors, who are in agreement that no changes to the existing Plan design and/or benefit structure should be made without first obtaining an analysis of the cost of such changes from the RHC Trust's actuary. Accordingly, the RHC Trust's actuary is currently in the process of preparing the RHC Trust's annual actuarial valuation for the year ended December 31, 2015, as well as a cost analysis of the extension of additional benefits to those members and/or beneficiaries not currently eligible for benefits under the Plan.

In light of the foregoing, the Board will not approve any changes to the design and benefit structure under the Plan until it has received an analysis of the estimated cost of such changes from its actuary. In the interim the Board will continue to diligently monitor and attend to those existing areas of concern as well as any additional concerns that may arise. Upon receipt of an acceptable cost analysis from its actuary along with the annual actuarial valuation identifying the RHC Trust's current funded status, the Board, in its sole discretion, may decide to revise the Plan design and benefit structure as deemed reasonable and prudent.
